



# Badru Taofeek Abiodun

#### **Exhibition Statement**

Solo exhibition by Badru Taofeek, Absa L'Atelier 2022 Ambassador

Leadership is often adorned with prestige and reverence, yet beneath its splendour lies an unspoken narrative of burden, sacrifice and internal conflict. Thorns and Crown unravels this tension and explores the unseen weight of authority through a series of hand embroidery, textile installations and bronze works.

At the heart of this exhibition is the Yoruba beaded crown, a powerful emblem of leadership, cultural heritage and influence. While it radiates honour, its intricate beadwork also hints at the quiet struggles that accompany positions of power. Through meticulous craftsmanship and layered symbolism, Thorns and Crown invites viewers to reflect on the paradox of success, where admiration and responsibility are inseparably entwined.

The human figure, central to this body of work, is rendered with hand embroidery in skin-tone threads to emphasise the labour-intensive and deeply personal nature of identity and existence. Each stitch mirrors the complexities of leadership – painstakingly built, yet fragile under scrutiny. The figure's trousers, hand-printed with Adire Eleko patterns using acrylic paint, further ground the works in Yoruba artistic traditions. Adire Eleko, a textile known for its rich storytelling and historical significance, becomes a visual metaphor for resilience that reinforces the connection between past and present struggles of leadership.

By blending embroidery, textile manipulation and abstraction, Thorns and Crown challenges the audience to look beyond the visible symbols of power. It prompts a deeper contemplation of what it means to lead: to carry the crown, but also to bear its thorns.

# Artist Statement

#### **Badru Taofeek**

Badru Taofeek is a Nigerian multimedia artist whose work includes hand-embroidered, textile installations, linear paintings and sculptures. He was born in Abeokuta, Ogun State, a city known for its rich artistic heritage. Badru started his journey in art at the Federal College of Education, Abeokuta, where he focused on sculpture and textiles. He later earned a Bachelor of Arts and a Master of Fine Arts in Fine and Applied Arts (Textile Design) from Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile-Ife, in Osun State, Nigeria.

Badru's art is deeply inspired by Yoruba culture, African myths, history, proverbs and folklore. He uses traditional Adire Eleko patterns and hand-woven fabrics, and combines them with powerful symbols to tell meaningful stories. His work reflects his deep respect for indigenous spirituality and his skill in blending tradition with modern ideas.

He has exhibited his art in Nigeria and internationally. Highlights include the Textile Biennale Image of Power at the Museum Rijswijk, Netherlands, where he won the Viewers' Choice Award in 2023 with a benefit of a fully sponsored solo exhibition titled We Are Gods at the museum in 2024. His exhibitions, such as the two-man show Me & Him in Lagos and his solo shows, showcase his ability to connect with audiences through rich, cultural storytelling.











On The Road To Damascus

Thread and Acrylic on Linen 72 x 152 cm each (triptych) 2024-2025




Adégboro I (Series)

Thread and Acrylic on Linen 101 x 152 cm 2025










